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- Serve as a regional resource for new colleges to development projects consistent with Panel standards;

- Leverage the resources of the Community Colleges to meet the diverse needs of the employers within the State of California;
- Assist colleges that have existing agreements successfully complete their agreements.

Responsibilities and performance requirements of Executive Members are:

- Members will serve as advocates for lower and mid-skilled workers;
- Attend Panel meetings whenever feasible;
- Provide or present to the Panel as appropriate, performance data regarding the success of the Community College MEC's;
- Participate in group conference calls;
- Work to collaboratively support and clarify the intent of the Employment Training Panel and the services made available through the colleges.

Experience/Role

- Those who are selected to serve on the Executive Committee should meet the following requirements:
- Have first-hand experience managing an ETP funded project in order to understand and guide ongoing Panel policy;
- Members should serve in a community college role that is directly involved in workforce training.
