Dear Senators Mitchell and Portantino,

We are writing in support of Governor Brown's 115<sup>th</sup> community college – a fully online campus that will deliver skills and industry-valued credentials that millions of working adults need to advance their careers and improve their economic future. **Our organization fully supports this initiative and urges you to enact this historic proposal.**

We find it troubling that more than 2.5 million working Californians aged 25 to 34 – of whom 49 percent are Latino, 31 percent white, 9 percent Asian and 7 percent African American – currently cannot access the educational pathways needed for economic mobility. Many are primary household wage earners, work full-time jobs, care for family, and are unable to attend classes at a brick and mortar campus during a traditional academic year.


